General Information

Ottershaw Infant and Junior are two Federated Church of England schools for children from 3 to 11 years and are academies in The Good Shepherd Trust. We currently have a two form intake at 4+ (60 pupils) and a two form intake at 7+ (60 pupils). The Nursery unit at the Infant school takes children in the term following their third birthday.

Accommodation

How will my child spend his/her day?

Mrs Hastings or Mrs Jenkyn welcome the children into the school at the main gate from 8.30am. The class teachers will be in their classrooms from then.

Our school day starts at 8.45am when the registers are taken. If you arrive after this time and are late for any reason, please take your child to the office so that we can register them.

The first session of the day lasts until 10.15am when the school gathers together for an assembly. Playtime follows from 10.30 - 10.45am. After play we have our second session which takes us up to lunch at 12.00. Lunch time runs until 1.00pm. There may be occasions when the class teacher reads with your child during this time. The afternoon session runs between 1.00pm and 3.15pm. We do not have a formal break in the afternoon however, the class teacher may decide to take their class outside for a 'brain break'.

We ask parents to collect their children from outside their classroom at 3.15pm, the end of the school day. Parents may enter the school playground from 3.05pm. In an emergency situation if you are going to be late to collect your child at the end of the day then please could you inform the office, where your child will be looked after until you arrive.

Change of circumstances

If your child is being collected by another adult at the end of the school day, it is important that we know. Please either email the school office at infant@ottershawcofeschools.surrey.sch.uk or complete and hand in to the school office a 'Change of Circumstances' form — these are available from outside the school office. This information will be passed on to the class teacher. Please note we will not release a child to any adult without prior notification.

Should you have a regular collection arrangement, such as 'granny picks up every Tuesday', please confirm this by email to the school office at the beginning of the school year so we can share this with the class teacher.

Absences

It is very important that in case of absence, however short, parents notify the school. In the interest of your child's safety, we request a telephone call or email before the start of the school day. If we have not received notification by this time, we will contact you by text or phone to ascertain the reason for non-attendance. Oral messages from children cannot be accepted.

Where possible we would ask parents to arrange any dental/medical appointments outside school hours. Should this not be possible, parents are requested to show the office the appointment letter, card, text or email. Children should be collected from and returned to the school office where they will need to be signed out of school/back in upon return.

Please note we are required to document all absences from school and the reasons for them. Until we receive confirmation of absences from parents, any absence will be recorded as unauthorised.

Leave of absence in term time will only be authorised in very exceptional circumstances, please refer to our Attendance policy.



Assemblies

Our assemblies are held daily. They are led by a number of people and follow a range of themes.

Monday: Theme of the week led by

Mrs Hastings or Mrs Jenkyn.

Tuesday: Teacher-led assembly.

Wednesday: Bible Stories/Songs of Praise led by Rev'd Mark.

Thursday: 'Thoughtful time' class assembly.

Friday: Celebration assembly led by

Mrs Hastings or Mrs Jenkyn.



Breaktime

From breakfast to lunchtime can seem a very long time! So, as part of the Schools Fruit and Vegetable Scheme, we provide each child with a piece of fruit or vegetable at playtime.

We have been awarded 'Healthy Eating in Schools' which means that we are committed to healthy eating. Therefore biscuits, crisps, fruit winders, etc. are not permitted in school.

It is important for your child to bring a bottle of water so that they have something to drink throughout the day. For safety reasons we do not allow glass bottles or hot drinks.

All children under 5 are also entitled to a carton of free milk daily. Once children turn 5 you are also able to purchase subsidised milk through Cool Milk, who operate our milk scheme. If you would like to register your child to receive milk, please visit www.coolmilk.com



Things to Bring

- An old shirt or overall that can be used for art and craft work.
- A spare pair of socks and underpants.
- A bookbag available from our uniform supplier.

Donations

- We do request that parents donate a box of tissues and a PRITT gluestick at the start of the school year.
- We would also be grateful if parents could make a small voluntary contribution of £10 to the School Fund. This goes towards items such as ingredients for cooking and making our own play dough and other messy play activities. We encourage all parents to make payments online, details of your child's online account with SCOPAY will be sent home early in the Autumn Term.



Uniform

At our school we have a very distinctive uniform that is purple and black. Sweatshirts and cardigans with the school logo can be ordered online from our uniform supplier MAPAC at www.mapac.com/education/parents All other items can be purchased from any retailer stocking standard uniform items.

We also ask for children in Sparrows and Robins to bring in a spare pair of socks and pants just in case they have any toilet accidents. **Please ensure that <u>ALL</u> uniform is clearly named**.

For PE each Year Group has their own PE day when children wear their PE kit to school for the whole day. When your child starts school, we will advise you which day of the week this will be.

- A protective garment such as an old shirt for art and craft activities

Please note that it is standard education policy that earrings are not worn in PE lessons. We ask that children who are unable to remove their own earrings do not wear them on PE days otherwise, they will not be able to take part in the PE session. If your child does wear earrings, these must be study only.

Our PTA hold second hand uniform sales throughout the year when parents have the opportunity to purchase donated pre-loved items. These are advertised via our weekly newsletter and by following www.facebook.com/ottershawpta.

Lunches

All full time children take their lunch together in the school hall. A healthy nutritious home cooked meal is prepared daily on site by our catering team from Caterlink.

All Infant children (aged 4-7 yrs) are entitled to receive Universal Infant Free School Meals, provided for from government funding. Whilst we do not insist that all children take a school meal we do encourage you to take advantage of this option. Please be assured, we will advise you if your child is not eating well as we believe it is so important for children to be well-nourished to get through the busy school day!

For children with a known food allergy or intolerance, Caterlink can provide a school meal on completion of their Food Allergy & Intolerance Form. This must be supported by a referral letter from a medical professional (GP/consultant/dietician) before an individualised menu can be provided.



Should you decide for your child to bring packed lunches, we do ask you to continue our 'Healthy Eating' policy by encouraging your child to have a healthy packed lunch, i.e. no chocolate biscuits, crisps or sweets. We also have some children with severe nut allergies and therefore ask you **not** to include nuts or products containing nuts, ie. peanut butter spread or chocolate spread.

If you are not going to take up the offer of a school lunch we do ask for a week's notice of your intention to change to a packed lunch. Please contact the school office.

Reading

We place great importance on reading at our school. We ask parents to read with their children on a daily basis. Children will bring home a phonics reading book which will be changed twice a week. Alongside this we operate a 'book bands' reading programme that allows children to choose from a wide and varied range of texts pitched at their reading level. Children will be assessed on a half termly basis and moved to the next book band as and when appropriate. Your child will also have a reading record book in which you and their teachers can note any comments.

All children will need a book bag to carry their books and homework to and from school. These are available from our uniform supplier.

In the Autumn term we invite parents to a reading/phonics workshop to guide you through our approach and how you can help your child at home.

Behaviour

The school policy is to reinforce and rewards good behaviour. We set high standards in the interest of both the individual and the school community. Our Behaviour Policy is available to view on the school website.

It is our aim that every child should feel secure and happy at school and we actively work with children and parents to prevent bullying. Parents are encouraged to talk to the class teacher, Deputy Headteacher or Headteacher about any incidents which may arise so that these can be addressed quickly and positively.

Teachers agree class rules with pupils at the beginning of each academic year, in line with the whole school Behaviour Policy; and these are reinforced regularly. Consistent reward systems are in place across both schools.

What if my child has additional needs?

From time to time some children need additional support within the classroom. We endeavour to identify children at the earliest possible time as we firmly believe that early intervention is key. In these cases, where appropriate an individual support plan will be devised and you would be invited into school to discuss this.

Our approach at Ottershaw is designed to promote independent learning and resilience. Whilst adults may offer additional support, they are not always with the child, or assigned to any child on a 1:1 basis all day.

Assessment

We implement the statutory Reception Baseline Assessment, and continually assess children throughout the year in order to effectively plan next steps in their learning. At the end of Reception Year, we will complete the statutory Foundation Stage Profile Assessment for each child. We share information regarding your child's progress both formally and informally.



Parent Meetings

We hold regular "Meet the Teacher" sessions to share information regarding Year Group routines and curriculum content. In addition, we hold three parents' evenings each year. One in the Autumn term so that the teacher and parents can discuss how children are settling into their new class. The second in the Spring term to discuss progress and set targets, and finally one in the Summer term when parents are invited to come into school to collect their child's end of year report, and to celebrate the work the children have done over the course of the year.



Frequently Asked Questions

How can I help in school?

We welcome any voluntary help within the school. All helpers need to have an enhanced clearance from the Disclosure & Barring Service (DBS) and complete our Volunteer Application Pack. Please see our office staff for further information on DBS checks.

What if my child is on medication?

We can only administer prescribed medication. It will be kept in the office and administered as per your written instructions. The necessary forms for this must be completed and signed when the medicines are handed in. All medicines must be in their original packaging with the pharmacy label attached identifying dosage and the name of child it is prescribed for. All medicines must be handed in to the school office and not left with the children in the classroom.

We will not administer over-the-counter medicines to your child although we do allow parents to come in and do this themselves.



If we are late, what do we do?

If you are late, please bring your child to the office to sign your child in.

How do I speak to a teacher?

Teachers are more than happy to meet with parents. You can make arrangements via the school office to see them after the school day.

How do I find out more about what my child is learning?

At the end of each week, we email parents Mrs Hastings weekly newsletter. Our school website is also an invaluable source of information.

Teachers use the Marvellous Me system to keep you informed of your child's activities and achievements at school. Registration details for the application will be forwarded to parents at the start of the Autumn Term.

As the Autumn Term progresses, you will also be given login information for your child's Microsoft Teams account. This account will remain with your child throughout their time at Ottershaw and is how children access their homework from Year 1 upwards.



How do I obtain school information?

Most letters are sent electronically unless they require a consent signature from the parent. We also operate a texting service for emergencies. Please keep your contact details up to date. Should a parent require a paper copy of information we would normally share electronically, please ask at the school office.

How do I make any payments to the school?

Once your child has started school we will set up an online account for you with SCOPAY. A letter with instructions along with your individual log on details will be sent home early in the Autumn Term. We encourage all parents to make payments online.

The Ottershaw Parent Teacher Association
