School Attendance

I'm sure you are all aware of the national attendance guidance that came into effect on 19th August this year. It has been on the horizon for some time and was published by the previous government in March 2024. The guidance applies to all state schools, with the responsibility for implementation and policy falling to individual Local Authorities and Multi Academy Trusts.

You may remember that The Good Shepherd Trust wrote to you all last term explaining its position. I am re-attaching the letter and our Attendance Policy for your reference.

In truth, although wording has changed and the use of fines is now expected and widely publicised in the media, the expectations have not really changed – all children who are enrolled at Ottershaw are expected to attend school every day unless they are too poorly to come in!

The national standard for 'good attendance' is 96% or more. This can be achieved so long as your child misses no more than 6 days of school (12 school sessions).

Most Ottershaw children already follow this expectation and have good attendance, even if they have inevitably been too poorly to come to school for a couple of days. Our biggest area of weakness is unauthorised absence for family holidays and events. Holiday absence, combined with a few days off because your child is ill, drops you into the category of Persistent Absence and this is where the spotlight is on us/you.

As always, if the absence is entirely unavoidable, you will not be penalised but we do expect every family to prioritise their child's education.

Finally, can we please remind all parents, but especially those providing a packed lunch for their child, that we are a nut free school. This means that nuts in any form (including in peanut butter and hazelnut chocolate spreads, such as Nutella) are not allowed in school. Similarly, for snack at the Junior School, we only allow fresh fruit and vegetables or dried fruit. We have people in our school with severe (life threatening) nut allergies and it is important we all help to keep them safe in this regard. Thank you.
