The children have certainly enjoyed their 'Break the Rules day today – thank you so much for paying your 'fines' for breaking our uniform rules in advance!! I think, at first, some of the older children were hoping that they would be able to break all the school rules today so we did some extra work earlier in the week to reassure them that we always expect them to 'Try Hard, Be Nice' and that most of our rules are needed to keep them safe. I'm pretty sure they understood because we've had a normal day of good behaviour!

Our other great highlight of the week was our Nursery Easter Assembly! Well done to the Nursery Team for preparing the children so well – to see our 3 and 4 year olds stand up and show their work, sing and say things to a large audience is quite an incredible sight. I'm sure parents were as proud of their children as we were (and enjoyed a trip up to Nursery afterwards).

As always, we have been looking at the progress of all the children as we near the end of term. One thing that is standing out for us, and will be a big feature of our teaching from Year 2 upwards next term, is encouraging children to spot the simple mistakes they are making with their punctuation (especially remembering to use capital letters and full stops accurately). I know we sound like stuck records sometimes, but this is such a key requirement of writing. When you are working on spellings at home, feel free to write some sentences together and make sure those capital letters and full stops have been remembered and used!

Whilst talking about English, many of you may have already seen the recent news article encouraging families to turn on the subtitles when watching a television or tablet at home. The aim is to give children even more opportunities to read at home and within their daily activities. I can certainly see how following the sub-titles and listening at the same time could help with fluency of high frequency words and teach new vocabulary at the same time – who knows, you might spot a few more capital letters and full stops along the way!
