Dear Parents and Carers,

This half term has whizzed by! We finished with an amazingly busy week – our specific highlights were:

- The beautiful Year 5 Art Exhibition on Thursday, with each child creating and reflecting on their images of space. Many thanks to the Delight Charity for providing all the materials, lessons and guidance for us to create our art and to all the parents who came to enjoy the exhibition.
- Our celebration of the Winter Olympics, with all the children in Years 1 – 6 experiencing 'new age kurling' sessions (great fun). Many thanks to our friends at Active Surrey for lending us the equipment to use.
- All our learning to help the children keep themselves safe and develop a healthy use of the internet on Safer Internet Day. Thank you to Mrs Ali for organising all our activities. We do hope the parents who joined the Eduthing Online Workshop for parents on Tuesday evening found the information useful. Internet Safety is something which can really impact child safety at home.
- Year 3 enjoyed their time on Wednesday with the Delight in Dance instructors and loved telling the Heroes and Villains story with them. We are looking forward to inviting parents to see our performance on Tuesday 24th March in the afternoon (probably at 1.45pm but we will confirm once we have finalised timings).
- Year 6 'Bikeability' training. We know our older children are starting to gain their independence with many of them already walking home (or part of the way) on their own and, for those who are out and about on their bikes, learning to ride safely on the roads is essential. Well done to all the children who successfully took part and passed their stage 2!

OPAL Update

Even though our field (and woods) are extremely boggy, we are still forging ahead with plans to expand the play offer and really hope the rain stops when we return after half term. Village Litter Collection



Attendance

Finally, can I please remind you all of the importance of good (95% or better) school attendance. I know that many of us have been struck down with nasty bugs this year and, quite rightly, when your children have been poorly they have had time at home to recover. I also know that, on bad traffic days, we can be affected by lateness. However, our statistics at this time are not good and attendance is dipping, hence my gentle reminder. [Is my child too ill for school? - NHS](#)



If your child/children are out of school without authority for 5 or more days (which do not have to be consecutive), then the following will apply:

1. If you have not incurred a penalty notice relating to this child/children in a rolling 3 year period since 19 August 2024, then the penalty notice will be charged at the rate of £160.00, **per parent/carer per child**, if paid within 28 days. This will be reduced to £80.00 if paid within 21 days of receipt of the notice. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice will result in Surrey County Council considering legal proceedings against you in the Magistrates Court.
2. If you have incurred a penalty notice relating to this child/children since 19 August 2024, the rolling 3 year period will be activated from the date of the first penalty notice and the second penalty notice will be charged at the flat rate of £160.00, **per parent/carer per child**, if paid within 28 days. There will be no reduction for payment within 21 days. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice will result in Surrey County Council considering legal proceedings against you in the Magistrates Court.
3. If you have incurred 2 penalty notices relating to this child/children in the rolling 3 year period since the first penalty notice was issued, then you will NOT receive a third penalty notice – Surrey County Council will have no option but to consider a prosecution, **per parent/carer per child**, in the Magistrates Court under s444 Education Act 1996.

Surrey County Council is not responsible for authorising pupil absence and therefore cannot withdraw any Penalty Notice requests without the written permission of the Headteacher.
