

As a rule of thumb, if you would struggle to make your journey into work it is likely that school staff will be in exactly the same position as you! Rather than clog up systems, we will only contact you and update the website if we are closed.

Finally, can we please remind you all that children need to have a coat in school every day (and hats and gloves if possible). Please name everything – it is the only way we can return lost items to the correct child. Thank you.
